- 22 Oct Some thieves broke into SF Clothiers Shop & stole several pieces of cloth.
- Theodore Bates died at SF. at 84-0-13
- BT & BS went to River Farm and found two yoke of oxen stolen.

 One was for beef, one for working.
- In Waterford, found that the oxen had been brought there on the 26th and sold by "a youngster about 21 years" for \$140; said they must be killed, they were so unruly, and accordingly they were killed by the 28th.
- 2 Nov Brethren in West Troy about oxen, when Elder Brother sent for them because "George Wood was here with his mother avisiting (for they were suspicious he was the one that stole the oxen). Accordingly they got a constable and took him this side of Kirks and he proved to be the thief and was sent to jail forthwith at Albany."
- SB & BT were to Waterford and settled with the butchers for the oxen by taking two yoke of cattle.
- 11 Morrell B. started for Johnstown "for basket timber."
- Sent Chloe Giles' Drunk and one sewing chair to her by a Welshman, Hugh Jones, to Utica. "Deposited here since the fall of 1834."
- Sisters finish husking corn, brethren work on road, load of brooms taken to Albany to be sent west.
 - "This even" when we were in meeting on our knees in silent prayers, the lamp cord burnt off and let the globes fall which, of course, broke to atoms and gave the assembly quite a shock."
 - 18 Went after poke root SB, CM & DS.
 - SB gave G. Peavey \$20 to move his family here from Canterbury.
 - 24 Calvin Green taken home; had been here 4 weeks.
 - SB went to West Troy and bought a Priam cooking stove for the dwelling house cookroom.
 - Took out old Rotary stove purchased in 1836 & put up Priam.
 - 8 Dec Alex Youngs dressed the grist mill stones.
 - 10 Dec Geo. Peavey arrived at SF with his family from Canterbury.
 - 12 CC went to Guilderland and settled with clothier for making cloth \$349.44.
 - "We understood by the world that Lydia Wood committerd suicide last Monday, 14th, by cutting her throat with a pair of scissors and died in 5 minutes at John Baker's house in Albany."
