- 7 "Reece's boys came with their mother this morning to make a confession concerning the mischief done on the Island etc."
- 9 11 visitors in all for dinner.
- 10 Brought Woodruff from Albany "to show our folks about laying the cellar bottom in the new part" (of the dwelling house).
- 13 LA made nectarine and peach sauce.
- 15 Draw lime for the cellar and salt for the compost.  
"A foot pedlar came, we bought some few things and by mistake Moriah Gillet's spectacles got in his trunk; he came back nearly 2 miles to bring them; had it not been for his honesty we never should have known what became of them."
- 16 "Joshua B. Stone came hoping to find a back order where he could have another privilege; he seems to feel quite bad, wanted the brethren & sisters should forgive him if he had hurt their feelings. We gave him dinner etc."
- 17 "Widow Van Rensselaer bought \$5 worth."
