- 30 Some of the brethren went after the two German boys.
- 2 May School opened 52 students. (These would have been all girls.)
- A woman came here with a little she wanted us to take. We did. She is from Cohoes.
- 20 "C. Prentiss had a large table made for the back door. I painted it."

- "Masons went to the Island to under pin the barn. They have raised the barn higher on account of the water coming into it when the river rises."
 "There is no peace to the wind today but blow, blow."
- CM & DS went to Schenectady in search of Dick who has strayed away from home or been stolen.

 Some of the neighbors came with Dick before the brethren got home.
