- 17 Stanton went to Clifton Park to get the Slipner woman to "bind her two boys." Took her home on 18th.
- 23 (Sun) "Strange things, we have no kind of visitors today."
- 2 Nov Geo. Price went to Albany & brought home the new wash mill made at Canterbury.
- A girl came here wishing to stay with us; we took her on trial. Her name is Josephine Orcutt. 11.
- A man came here from Troy after religion. He stayed over night, then went to SF.
- A man came here by the name of Duane from Schenectady. He wanted to make a trial with a new plough. He stayed a day or so, did not make out much with his plough.
- 17 The new washhouse gets along very slowly.

- Thanksgiving. The CF and NF & all the families attend meeting in the MF, "had a long & good meeting." PAB stayed in the washhouse to work, as there was need of it to keep the work going on (processing the meat).
